Judge Rampersad was appointed to the bench by Governor Inslee in 2023. Prior to this appointment, she served as a King County District Court Judge, where she chaired the court's Diversity Equity and Inclusion Committee. She founded the Joint Minority Mentorship Program.

Judge Glasgow was elected to Division Two in 2018 and began serving as Chief Judge in 2022. She is a founding member of the Judicial Institute and has received the WWL's Legacy Award and the WSBA's Outstanding Judge Award.

#### *Office of the Governor*
